Fast Fashion is Harmful to the Environment

The average US consumer disposes 50-85 lbs. Of clothing a year

The fashion industry is the world's 2nd largest polluter

The plastic in clothing stays in the environment so the pile of thrown away clothing is growing larger and larger





You probably don't know where your clothes come from

In order to produce cheap clothing, the labor to create your clothes has to be cheap

In Bangladesh, people who work on clothing are only given 2 dollars a day, thus being kept in the cycle of extreme poverty





What can you do to help?

Consumer smarter

- 1. Think of where you're buying your clothes a. Don't buy from Zaara, Forever 21,
- 2. Buy Less clothing
- 3. Buy from thrift stores
 a. You never know what you'll find
- 4. Buy higher quality clothes
 a. May be more expensive, but lasts longer!
